GoI constitutes committee for assessment of relief to bank borrowers

Government of India has constituted an Expert **Committee** for making an overall assessment of relief to bank borrowers related to waiver of interest and waiver of interest on interest on the COVID-19 related **moratorium**. State Bank of India will provide secretarial support to the committee. The Committee may consult banks or other stakeholders, as deemed necessary, for the purpose.

The **Expert Committee** shall be as under:

- Rajiv Mehrishi, former CAG of India Chairperson
- Ravindra H. Dholakia, former Professor, IIM Ahmedabad & ex- Member, Monetary Policy Committee of Reserve Bank of India
- B. Sriram, Former Managing Director, State Bank of India & IDBI Bank

The **terms of reference** of the committee shall be as under:

- Measuring the impact on the national economy and financial stability of waiving of interest and waiving of interest on interest on the COVID-19 related moratorium
- Suggestions to mitigate financial constraints of various sections of society in this respect and measures to be adopted in this regard
- Any other suggestions/observations that may be necessary given the current situation.

RBI issued a notice on Compliance functions in banks and role of CCO

Reserve Bank of India has released a notice on Compliance Functions in Banks and the Role of Chief **Compliance Officer (CCO).** According to the compliance system Banks required, to have an effective compliance culture, independent corporate compliance function, and a strong compliance risk management programme at the bank and group level. Such an independent compliance function is required to be headed by a designated Chief Compliance Officer (CCO). Check here the details about Compliance Functions in Banks and the Role of Chief **Compliance Officer (CCO):**

The duties and responsibilities of the compliance function

The compliance function is to help the bank in managing its compliance risk, which can be defined as the risk of legal or regulatory sanctions, financial loss, or loss to prominence a bank may suffer as a result of its failure to fulfil with all applicable laws, regulations, codes of conduct and standards of good practice (together, "laws, rules and standards"). Compliance risk is sometimes also introduced to as integrity risk because a bank's prominence is closely connected with its adherence to principles of integrity and fair dealing. Banking supervisors must be satisfied that effective compliance policies and procedures are followed and that management takes appropriate corrective action when breaches of laws, rules, and standards are identified.

These shall include at least the following activities:

- To appraise the Board and senior management on regulations, rules, and standards, and any further developments.
- To provide clarification on any compliance-related
- To conduct an assessment of the compliance risk (at least once a year) and to develop a risk-oriented activity plan for compliance assessment. The activity plan should be submitted to the ACB for approval and be made available to the internal audit.
- To report promptly to the **Board / ACB / MD & CEO** about any major changes/observations relating to the compliance risk.
- To periodically report compliance failures/breaches to the Board/ACB and circulating to the concerned functional heads.
- To monitor and periodically test compliance by performing sufficient and representative compliance testing. The results of the compliance testing should be placed on Board/ACB/MD & CEO.
- To examine the sustenance of compliance as an integral part of compliance testing and annual compliance assessment exercise.
- To ensure compliance of Supervisory observations made by RBI and/or any other directions in both letter and spirit in a time-bound and sustainable manner.






Role of Chief Compliance Officer (CCO)

A Chief Compliance Officer (CCO) is a corporate official in charge of overseeing and managing compliance issues within the Bank, for example, that a bank is complying with regulatory requirements and that the company and its employees are complying with internal policies and procedures.

Role of the Chief Compliance Officer Includes following:

- Bank compliance officers are accountable for conducting audits and inspections to make sure a bank adheres to set internal and external laws.
- They are responsible for entails monitoring and analyzing risk areas in a bank's operation to ensure observance of state or federal laws.
- Bank compliance officers assess policies/procedures and ensure they are in line with all regulations on mortgage and customer deposits.
- The research established banking laws to ensure the non-violation of federal laws.
- They also implement and adjust to new regulations passed by state or federal government bodies.
- As part of their work description, CCO officers give compliance advice to the risk management unit of an organization.
- They cooperate with the bank chief operating officer to ensure proper implementation of compliance policies.
- They also carry out research to stay abreast of public interest and consumer protection laws.
- The role of compliance officers in banks also involves taking care of the training of newly recruited personnel and bank staff.
- They conduct audits to spot areas of non-compliance and initiate solutions to address identified risks.
- They also plan and execute compliance programs to educate bank staff on new regulations.



THE World University Ranking 2021 Announced

ISA host World Solar Technology Summit

On 8th September 2020, The 1st World Solar Technology Summit was held virtually. The summit was inaugurated by Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi. The main objective of the summit is to pay attention to state-of-the-art technologies and next-generation technologies. Such technologies will play an important role in making solar energy more efficiently, more than 26,000 participants from 149 nations joined the summit virtually.

The first World Solar Technology Summit (WSTS) is organised by the International Solar Alliance (ISA) along with Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI), as the convenor of ISA Global Leadership Task Force on Innovation, to focus on new Technologies and Innovations in the field of Solar.

Nobel Laureate Dr Michael Stanley Whittingham also presented a Keynote address. He is an awardee of Nobel Prize in Chemistry (jointly with John B Goodenough & **Akira Yoshino)** in 2019 for the revolutionizing discovery of the lithium-ion batteries.

Conclave on "School Education in 21st Century" begins

A two-day conclave on 'School Education in 21st Century' commenced virtually. The conclave has been organised by Ministry of Education as part of Shikshak Parv 2020. Shikshak Parv is being celebrated from 8th-25th September, 2020 to felicitate the teachers and to take New Education Policy 2020 forward. The conclave was addressed by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi under the National Education Policy- 2020 (NEP-2020). The conclave featured the discussions held in two technical sessions on six subjects of New Education Policy 2020. The first technical session started with a discussion on the subject of 'Foundational Literacy and Numeracy'. Venkaiah Naidu released 'The State of Young Child in India' report

Vice President of India, Venkaiah Naidu has released "The State of Young Child in India" report. The report was prepared by a policy advocacy organization, Mobile Creches. The report measured Health and Nutrition in the

According to the report, there 159 million children aged below 6 years in India out of the 21 per cent are undernourished, 36 per cent are underweight and 38 per cent do not receive full immunization. According to the analysis on expense towards child nutrition, healthcare, education and other protection services, India has spent **Rs 1,723 per child** in 2018-2019, which is insufficient to reach the entire eligible population. The report has also released the list of Best-performing states & worstperforming states based on the Young Child Outcomes Index.

The Young Child Outcomes Index (YCOI) measures health, nutrition and cognitive growth with help of indicators such as infant mortality rate, stunting and net attendance at the primary school level. Based on the index, eight states have scored below the country's average. They are Assam, Meghalaya, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Iharkhand, Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. The index was constructed for two time periods 2005-2006 & 2015-2016 to provide inter-state comparisons and also provides an idea of change over time.

National Affairs


- Social Justice and Empowerment Ministry have launched a toll-free mental health rehabilitation helpline "KIRAN". The helpline was launched in view of the growing incidence of Mental Illness, particularly in the wake of COVID-19 pandemic.
- Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog, has launched the Aatmanirbhar Bharat ARISE-Atal New **India Challenges.** The programme will spur applied research and innovation in Indian MSMEs and startups. The initiative will help identify and promote innovations necessary for boosting the MSME sector.



- **India** and **Japan** signed an **agreement** concerning Reciprocal Provision of Supplies and Services between the Armed Forces of India and The Self-**Defense Forces of Japan.** The agreement will also improve the interoperability between the Armed Force of India and Japan thereby further increasing the bilateral defence engagements under the Special Strategic & Global Partnership between the two countries.

- On the occasion of Bank of India (BoI)'s 115th Foundation Day, BoI has launched an international contactless debit card, "Signature Visa Debit Card" for high net worth individuals who are maintaining an average quarterly balance of **Rs 10 lakhs** and above.
- Reserve Bank of India has ceased the Banking operations by the Aditya Birla Idea Payments (ABIP) Bank under Banking Regulations Act 1949 with effect from July 28, 2020.
- As per the EASE Banking Reforms Index 2.0, **Bank of** Baroda has been placed at the first spot. State Bank of India and Oriental Bank of Commerce (OBC) got the **2nd** and **3rd** place respectively. The **Indian** Banking Association (IBA) makes EASE (Enhanced Access and Service Excellence) reform index. The aim of this index is to bring fruitful change in the PSBs by brining in healthy competition among these PSBs and by encouraging them to learn from each other.
- State Bank of India is planning to launch a loan product named "SAFAL" for organic cotton growers. The product Safe and Fast Agriculture Loan (SAFAL) is primarily focussed on organic cotton growers who don't have any credit history. SBI will use Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML) for this purpose.
- Mastercard has launched "Central Bank Digital Currencies" (CBDCs), a Virtual Testing Environment for Central Banks to Assess and Explore National **Digital Currencies.** Mastercard has invited Central Banks, Commercial Banks and tech and advisory firms to evaluate the suitability of CBDCs in a country or region.
- ICICI Bank has launched a new product named "iStartup 2.0", to cater to the banking needs of startups and entrepreneurs. The programme for startups that takes care of their banking as well as beyond-banking needs such as regulatory assistance, analytics, staffing, accounting, customer acquisition and digital outreach to customers, among others.
- The Indian arm of Fitch Ratings, India Ratings and Research (Ind-Ra) has projected India's FY21 GDP growth forecast at -11.8% as against its earlier prediction of -5.3%. The rating agency also expects India's GDP to rebound and grow at 9.9% year-onyear in **FY22** primarily due to the weak base of FY21.
- **CRISIL** has projected **India's GDP rate** at **-9%** for the financial year 2020-21 (FY21). For FY22, Crisil has projected India's GDP to grow at 10%. For the next three years, between fiscals 2023 and 2025, CRISIL projects the Indian GDP to average a growth of 6.2% annually.

The rating agency, Moody's has projected the GDP growth rate for India to contract 11.5 per cent in fiscal 2020-21 (FY21) due to the coronavirus pandemic. For 2021-22 (FY22), Moody's projected the economy of India to grow at **10.6 per cent**.

- The 35th Session of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) Regional Conference for Asia and the Pacific (APRC 35) was held virtual format due to the global COVID-19 pandemic. The Conference was held under the Chair of the Host Country, Bhutan. The Union Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Parshottam Rupala represented India in the conference. The conference focused on regional priorities and issues such as COVID 19, the state of agriculture, natural resources management, food security and nutrition. - The **Education Ministers Meeting** will take place as part of the Sherpa Track for the G20 Leaders Summit 2020, which is to be hosted by Saudi Arabia at the end of 2020. The meet was chaired by Saudi Arabia's Education Minister Dr Hamad Al-Asheikh where India was represented by Union Minister of Education, Ramesh Pokhrival Nishank, in the virtual mode.

Ranks and Reports

India has been ranked 105th position "Global Economic Freedom Index 2020 Annual Report" by Canada's Fraser Institute, which has been released in India in conjunction with **Center for Civil Society**, New Delhi-based think tank. This is the 24th edition of Economic Freedom of the World. Hong Kong topped the Index with a score of 8.94, followed by Singapore (8.65) and New Zealand (8.53). The 10 lowest-rated countries are the African Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo, Zimbabwe, Algeria, Iran, Angola, Libya, Sudan and Venezuela.


Sports News


