# Neeraj Chopra Clinches Silver in Javelin at Paris 2024 Olympics

**Neeraj Chopra,** the reigning Olympic champion, put on an impressive display at the Paris Olympics, winning the silver medal in the men's javelin throw event. Chopra's season-best throw of **89.45m** earned him the runner-up position, but he was unable to defend his title, as Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem broke the **Olympic record** with a stunning throw of **92.97m**.

The **Team Chandrayaan-3** was recognized with the **Vigyan Team** award for their exceptional contribution to India's space program, particularly for the successful moon landing mission.







# **Award Ceremony and Significance**

# **National Space Day Celebration**

President Droupadi Murmu is expected to present these awards on **August 23**, designated as **National Space Day** to commemorate the landing of Chandrayaan-3 near the Moon's South Pole.

#### **Consolidation of Science Awards**

This new award system represents a significant consolidation of India's science honors. It replaces the previous system, which included the Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar award, instituted in 1958 and named after the renowned chemist who was the first chairman of the University Grants Commission and the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research.

# Top 10 Richest Global Central Banks in 2024

Central banks are the backbone of a nation's financial system, playing a pivotal role in maintaining **economic stability** and fostering **growth**. A striking observation in the 2024 rankings is the dominance of European central banks. Seven out of the top ten central banks are based in Europe, with a combined worth of an astounding \$11.09 trillion. This underscores the economic strength and financial stability of the European region.

# **African Absence**

Notably absent from the top 10 list are African central banks. This absence can be attributed to several challenges facing the region, including:

- 1. Rising inflation
- 2. Fragile financial markets
- 3. Weak monetary policy transmission systems

These factors highlight the economic disparities and developmental challenges that persist in certain regions.

#### **India's Position**

While not in the top 10, India's **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** holds a respectable 12th position globally. As of March 31, 2024, the RBI's balance sheet grew by **11.08**% year-on-year, reaching **Rs 70.47 trillion**. This growth is primarily attributed to the bank's liquidity management and foreign currency (forex) activities, reflecting India's growing economic influence on the global stage.
