Why in the news?	 A government report indicated Glacial lake in Himalayan region have experienced a 10.81% increase in area from 2011 to 2024. The total area of glacial lakes in India grew from 1,962 hectares in 2011 to 2,623 hectares in 2024, marking a 33.7% increase. A total of 67 lakes in India experienced over 40% increase in surface area, categorizing them as high-risk for GLOFs. The most notable expansions were recorded in Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Sikkim, and Arunachal Pradesh.

In contrast, India ranks 83rd, providing its citizens with visa-free access to 58 countries. This ranking underscores the challenges that Indian passport holders face in terms of global mobility. However, the growing emphasis on international relations may pave the way for improved access in the future.

The Henley Passport Index employs a meticulous methodology to determine passport rankings. This process involves evaluating several key factors, including:

- Visa-Free Access: The primary criterion is the number of countries a passport holder can enter without a visa. A higher number indicates greater travel freedom.
- **Diplomatic Relations**: The strength of a country's diplomatic ties significantly influences its passport power. Nations with robust international agreements tend to rank higher.
- International Agreements: The nature of treaties and agreements with other nations also plays a vital role in determining visa policies, further impacting passport rankings.

The World's Weakest Passports

While some passports grant their holders considerable travel freedom, others offer limited options. The Henley Passport Index 2024 highlights the least powerful passports, which require holders to obtain visas for most international travel. - New Delhi is considering inviting Indonesia's newly elected President, Prabowo Subianto, as the chief guest for Republic Day 2025, highlighting the strengthening ties between India and Indonesia. The potential invitation reflects plans for high-level discussions, enhanced defense cooperation, and the possible participation of the Indonesian military in the Republic Day parade. - India has unveiled its updated National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) at the 16th UN Biodiversity Conference in Colombia, committing to protect 30% of its terrestrial, inland water, and coastal marine areas by 2030. This goal aligns with the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, which aims for global protection of 30% of land and ocean areas. (Click here to read article)

- Karnataka is celebrating the Bali Padyami festival on the fourth day of Deepavali, marking the return of the Asura king, Bali Chakravarty, from Pathala Loka (the underworld) to Bhuloka (the earth), as granted by Lord Vishnu during his Vamana Avatar. The festival holds cultural significance in Hindu mythology. Deepavali festivities in Karnataka include worship of Ganga Matha on the first day, Naraka Chaturdashi on the second day, and Lakshmi Pooja on the third day. (Click here to read article)
- The Uttar Pradesh government has introduced a new policy to improve veterinary services by offering diploma and certificate courses in animal husbandry and para-veterinary medicine. This move, announced by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, aims to address the shortage of veterinarians in the state, which has only 8,193 veterinarians compared to the national total of around 34,500. 
