This day serves as a reminder of the enduring spirit of the Constitution and its role as a beacon of hope and justice for every Indian citizen.

Date and Historical Context

Constitution Day commemorates the adoption of the Constitution by the Constituent Assembly on November 26, 1949, which later came into effect on January 26, 1950celebrated as **Republic Day**. The day was formally designated as Samvidhan Diwas in 2015 by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, coinciding with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's 125th birth anniversary.

The Indian Constitution, under the leadership of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, was designed to ensure justice, liberty, and equality for all. This document, the longest written constitution in the world, initially had 395 Articles and 8 Schedules, embodying the essence of India's sovereignty and diversity.

The Journey of Drafting the Indian Constitution

The Need for a Framework

Formation of the Constituent Assembly

- On November 26, 1949, the Assembly adopted the Constitution, establishing India as a sovereign democratic republic.

Cabinet Approves PAN 2.0 Project

Digitization: Introduction of QR codes on PAN cards and significant upgrades to infrastructure for better security and user experience.

Improved Efficiency: The system promises faster service delivery, enhanced data consistency, and eco-friendly operations by minimizing paper use.

Centralized Ecosystem: Consolidation of core and non-core PAN/TAN activities for smoother operation and improved validation services.

Impact on Taxpayers

No Reapplication Needed: Current PAN cards will remain valid, and there is no need for taxpayers to reapply for a new card.

Enhanced User Experience: The digital transformation ensures quicker processing, increased security, and better integration across various government services, making the PAN a unified digital business identifier.

Free of Cost: The upgrades, including the addition of a QR code, will be provided free of charge to taxpayers.

55th International Film Festival of India 2024

The 55th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) came to a magnificent conclusion on 28th November 2024 at the Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Indoor Stadium, Goa, marking the end of a nine-day celebration of global and Indian cinema. The closing ceremony honored cinematic excellence, promoted creative dialogue, and celebrated young and seasoned filmmakers from across the globe.

This year's festival was unique, with a theme centred on "Young Filmmakers: The Future is Now." It showcased over 195 films, creating a platform for budding talent while paying homage to cinematic legends.

The closing ceremony was a blend of glamour and meaningful dialogue, celebrating the magic of storytelling. From dazzling performances to award presentations, the event honoured those who made significant contributions to the art of cinema.

The night ended with the screening of the closing film "Dry Season" by Czech filmmaker Bohdan Sláma, a moving story emphasizing sustainability and human relationships.

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi participated in the Odisha Parba 2024 celebrations held at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi from November 22-24, organized by the Odia Samaj. - The Government of India launched the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) with a ₹2,481 crore allocation, approved by the Union Cabinet on November 25, 2024. The scheme aims to promote natural farming for 1 crore farmers and cover 750,000 hectares over two years. It integrates past initiatives like Bhartiya Prakratik Krishi Paddhati and Gobardhan Mission to promote Zero Budget Natural Farming (ZBNF) and locally adapted methods. (Click here to read article)
- Union Minister for Education, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, launched The TeacherApp, a digital platform developed by Bharti Airtel Foundation to empower educators. The app offers 260+ hours of digital content, including courses, videos, podcasts, and live expert sessions. It aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 to enhance pedagogical skills, foster creativity, and improve classroom engagement. - The Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has received 28 proposals from 23 states for developing new cities, in line with the central government's initiative to address urban expansion. This follows a commitment made in February 2021 to create eight new cities, with an allocated Rs 8,000 crore for their development. Each city will receive Rs 1,000 crore, and the proposals are under review by an expert committee to ensure quality and adherence to 15th Finance Commission guidelines. (Click here to read article)
- The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) revealed that Telangana, Karnataka, and Maharashtra have reported the highest number of cybercrime cases in the past three years, with Telangana leading. Between 2020-2022, Telangana recorded 30,596 cases, Karnataka 31,433, and Maharashtra 19,307. To tackle this, the Central Government has introduced a 13-pronged strategy to strengthen cybercrime detection, investigation, and prosecution. (Click here to read
- Indian Railways launched the 'Sanraksha' mobile app to enhance passenger safety by training and building the capacity of railway staff. After a successful pilot in the Nagpur division, the app is being rolled out across 16 divisions and will eventually be implemented nationwide. - India has been re-elected to the United Nations Peacebuilding Commission (PBC) for the 2025-2026 term, emphasizing its continued commitment to global peace and stability. This re-election highlights India's role as a founding member and major contributor to UN peacekeeping efforts, reaffirming its ongoing engagement with the PBC since its establishment in 2005. - The Supreme Court Collegium, led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna, has proposed the elevation of Delhi High Court Chief Justice Manmohan to the Supreme Court. This recommendation comes as the court operates with 32 judges, two short of its sanctioned strength of 34, following the retirements of Justices DY Chandrachud and Hima Kohli. - The **Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly** approved a bill on November 21, 2024, to abolish the garbage tax introduced by the previous YSRCP government. Championed by Municipal Administration Minister P. Narayana, the move aims to ease financial pressure on citizens and investigate potential **contractor benefits** tied to the tax. - Hemant Soren is set to take oath as the Chief Minister of Jharkhand on November 28, after meeting Governor Santosh Kumar Gangawar to stake his claim to form the government. - The Delhi government expanded its old-age pension scheme to include 80,000 more senior citizens, raising the total beneficiaries to **5.3 lakh**. **Arvind Kejriwal** launched an online portal to streamline applications. - An international team of astronomers, led by Kathleen Charlton from the University of Cape Town, discovered a new giant radio galaxy (GRG) using the MeerKAT radio telescope in the Cosmological Evolution Survey (COSMOS) field. The discovery, published on November 11, 2024, reveals MGTC J100022.85+031520.4, a galaxy with remarkable properties that offer insights into galaxy evolution and radio source formation. GRGs are rare, massive structures known for their immense size and powerful emissions. (Click here to read article)
- TakeMe2Space (TM2Space), a Hyderabad-based space tech company, will launch India's first Al laboratory in space, MOI-TD, aboard ISRO's PSLV C60 rocket in December 2024. The mission will enable real-time in-orbit data processing, reducing data transmission costs and expanding space research access. Developed with support from IN-SPACe Technical Centre, the initiative aims to democratize space technology and accelerate India's space innovation. (Click here to read article)
- ISRO will launch the ESA's Proba-3 mission on December 4, **2024**, using the **PSLV-XL rocket**. The mission will study the Sun's corona through precision formation flying with two satellites: the Occulter Spacecraft (200 kg) and the Coronagraph Spacecraft (340 kg). This mission, the first of its kind, aims to create an artificial solar eclipse to observe the Sun's outer atmosphere, showcasing a technological breakthrough and international collaboration in space exploration. - ISRO has announced several groundbreaking initiatives, including the Shukrayaan Venus Mission set for launch in 2028 to explore Venus's atmosphere and surface. Other plans include advancements in lunar, Mars missions, the development of India's space station, and upgrades to weather and communication systems, reflecting India's growing ambitions in space exploration and interplanetary studies.
