# IIT Madras Completes 410-Meter Hyperloop Test Track

In a significant development for India's transportation future, the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras has successfully completed a 410-meter-long Hyperloop test track. This groundbreaking achievement was officially announced by Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and marks a major milestone in the country's pursuit of high-speed transportation technology. The project, which represents the first of its kind in India, is being developed as part of a collaboration between the Indian Railways, IIT Madras' Avishkar Hyperloop team, and TuTr, an innovative startup incubated at IIT Madras.

# What is Hyperloop Technology?

Hyperloop is an advanced transportation system that was originally proposed by Elon Musk in 2012. The system is designed to provide high-speed travel through low-pressure tubes, enabling vacuum-sealed environments significantly reduce air resistance and friction, which are typically encountered in traditional transport methods. The goal of the Hyperloop is to offer faster, energy-efficient,

- and sustainable transportation over long distances. With speeds potentially reaching over 1,000 kilometers per hour, Hyperloop could redefine travel, cutting down journey times significantly.
- The technology aims to combine high speed with low energy consumption, making it an environmentally friendly alternative to conventional transportation modes. The design allows for low operating costs and faster travel times, making it an ideal solution for the growing demand for efficient and quick travel in congested urban areas and along busy transportation corridors.

# **Project Phases**

The Hyperloop project at IIT Madras will be rolled out in two phases. The first phase involves the construction of an 11.5kilometer test track, which will be used primarily for testing and certification of the technology. This initial phase will showcase the core capabilities of the Hyperloop system, ensuring that it meets all technical, safety, and regulatory requirements before moving full-scale on to implementation.



In the second phase, the test track will be expanded to around 100 kilometers, bringing the project closer to its goal of becoming a commercially viable form of transport. The Mumbai-Pune corridor has been selected as the site for the first full-scale implementation of the Hyperloop, and it promises to revolutionize intercity travel. With speeds of up to **1,100 kilometers per hour**, the travel time between Mumbai and Pune could be reduced to just 25 minutes, a dramatic decrease from the current travel time of approximately 3 to 4 hours by road or rail.

# **Speed and Efficiency of Hyperloop Trains**

- One of the standout features of the Hyperloop system is its ability to achieve exceptional speeds. Hyperloop trains can reach speeds of up to 1,100 km/h, making it one of the fastest modes of ground transport in the world. However, for regular operation, the expected cruising speed of the Hyperloop system is around 360 km/h, which is still faster than conventional high-speed trains.
- The key to this extraordinary speed lies in the vacuumsealed environment within the tubes. In conventional systems, friction and air resistance act as significant barriers to speed. The low-pressure environment in Hyperloop tubes effectively eliminates these barriers, enabling the vehicles to travel with minimal drag, resulting in significantly faster travel times. Additionally, the system's energy efficiency is a major advantage, as the reduced resistance leads to lower energy consumption compared to traditional high-speed transportation.

## The Avishkar Hyperloop Team

- The success of the Hyperloop project at IIT Madras can largely be attributed to the dedicated efforts of the Avishkar Hyperloop team, consisting of 76 students from IIT Madras. This talented group of engineers, designers, and innovators is focused on developing the core technology for the Hyperloop system. The team's work involves extensive research and development, particularly in areas such as vacuum systems, propulsion systems, and aerodynamics.
- The students' commitment to pushing the boundaries of innovation has played a vital role in advancing the project, with their collaborative efforts ensuring that the technological challenges of creating a viable Hyperloop system are addressed. Their work will not only contribute to the success of the Hyperloop project but will also bolster India's position as a global leader in cutting-edge transportation technologies.

#### TuTr: A Key Partner in the Hyperloop Initiative

TuTr, a startup incubated at IIT Madras, is another crucial partner in the **Hyperloop project**. As a startup focused on advanced transportation technologies, TuTr brings valuable expertise to the table, particularly in areas like transportation system design and system integration. This collaboration between academia and industry is essential for the Hyperloop project's success, combining IIT Madras' research capabilities with TuTr's practical experience in developing and scaling innovative technologies.

The partnership with TuTr is expected to play a pivotal role in bringing the Hyperloop concept from the drawing board to reality, with the aim of enhancing India's transportation capabilities through advanced technological solutions.

# **Future Prospects: Mumbai-Pune Hyperloop**

- Once the test track is successfully completed and the technology is validated, the next step will be the implementation of the first full-scale Hyperloop system in India. The Mumbai-Pune corridor has been identified as the pilot project, and it promises to drastically reduce travel times between these two major cities. The potential benefits of such a system are immense, as it could not only reduce congestion and pollution but also create a more sustainable and **efficient** transportation network for India.
- Despite the progress made so far, it is important to note that the Hyperloop project is still in its development stage. Several challenges, such as regulatory approval, infrastructure development, and funding, remain to be addressed. However, the successful completion of the 410meter test track marks an important step toward realizing the vision of a high-speed, energy-efficient transportation system in India.

# National Panchayat Awards 2024: Celebrating Rural **Governance and Sustainable Development**

# Historical Context and Significance

# **Constitutional Foundations**

The awards commemorate the 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act of 1992, which granted constitutional status to Panchayats as institutions of local self-governance. Traditionally celebrated on April 24th, the 2024 ceremony was rescheduled due to the General Elections to the Lok Sabha.







Scale and Participation

In a testament to grassroots democratic participation, **1.94 lakh Gram Panchayats** competed in this year's awards. Notably, **42% of the 42 award-winning Panchayats** were led by women, highlighting the growing role of female leadership in rural governance.

**5. Panchayat Kshamta Nirmaan Sarvottam Sansthan Puraskar** Institutions from **Kerala, Maharashtra, and Odisha** were recognized for providing exceptional support to Panchayats in implementing Localization of Sustainable Development Goals. Selection Process: Ensuring Transparency and Excellence The awards featured a **rigorous multi-level evaluation process** involving committees from Block to National levels. Panchayats were assessed through detailed questionnaires covering nine LSDG themes, ensuring a comprehensive and fair assessment of their performance.

#### **Financial Recognition and Support**

A total of **46** crore rupees in prize money was distributed to 45 awardees, with funds directly transferred to their accounts. This financial recognition aims to motivate and support rural governance initiatives.

# Lok Sabha Passes Railways (Amendment) Bill 2024 Amid Disruptions

The Lok Sabha passed the Railways (Amendment) Bill, 2024 during the Winter Session despite disruptions, with Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw addressing concerns over potential privatisation. The bill aims to subsume the Railway Board Act, 1905, into the Railways Act, 1989, simplifying the legal framework while empowering the Railway Board with statutory powers. Opposition leaders raised concerns over privatisation, centralisation of authority, and representation of marginalised communities, which the minister dismissed as unfounded.

Key Provisions of the Bill

**Statutory Powers to Railway Board**: Grants the central government authority to determine the board's composition, qualifications, and terms of service, ensuring operational flexibility.

**Simplified Legal Framework**: Merges provisions of the Indian Railway Board Act, 1905, into the Railways Act, 1989, eliminating the need for dual references.

**Enhanced Connectivity**: Facilitates superfast train operations and expansions, including rerouting through Thawe Junction in Bihar, to benefit local communities and pilgrims.

Ministerial Clarifications and Achievements

**Privatisation Concerns Dismissed**: Vaishnaw assured that railway assets remain government-owned, describing privatisation fears as a "fake narrative."

**Decentralisation Emphasised**: Highlighted 100% delegation of tendering powers to zone general managers, accelerating project approvals and decentralisation.

**Improved Passenger Services**: Cited plans for 13,000 additional trains and ongoing production of 10,000 general coaches to cater to low-income passengers.

Historical Context and Need for Amendments

**Legislative Evolution**: The Indian Railways Act, 1890, governed railway operations until replaced by the Railways Act, 1989, which lacked statutory provisions for the Railway Board.



Simplification Goal: By incorporating the Railway Board Act of 1905, the amendment aligns historical provisions into a single, comprehensive framework for efficiency.

# Indian Heritage Conservation Projects Shine at UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards 2024

Indian Two heritage conservation projects—the Abathsahayeswarar Temple Conservation Project in Tamil Nadu and the BJPCI Conservation Project in Maharashtra—have garnered global recognition by winning the UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation 2024. These projects, celebrated for their commitment to preserving India's cultural legacy, were among the eight winners selected from the Asia-Pacific region.

The awards, announced by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) on 6 December 2024 at its regional office in Bangkok, Thailand, spotlight the efforts of individuals and organisations dedicated to restoring and conserving heritage sites across the region.

# **Abathsahayeswarar Temple Conservation Project**

- The Abathsahayeswarar Temple Conservation Project in Thukkatchi, Tamil Nadu, received the Award of Distinction, recognizing its exemplary efforts to safeguard a historic cultural treasure.
- **Temple Overview**
- The Abathsahayeswarar Temple, dedicated to Lord Dakshinamurthy (a form of Lord Shiva), is a revered religious site located in **Thukkatchi village** in the **Thiruvarur** District of Tamil Nadu. The temple holds historical and spiritual significance, as it is mentioned in the 7th-century Tamil Saivite text 'Thevaram' and is one of the Paadal Petra Sthalams (sacred places glorified in Tamil Shaivite literature).

#### **Award-Winning Conservation Efforts**

The conservation project was lauded for its innovative use of modern engineering expertise alongside the traditional knowledge of Hindu temple builders, known as sthapathis, to ensure the **structural conservation** of the temple. This harmonious blend of traditional and modern techniques exemplifies a sustainable approach to heritage preservation, earning the temple the UNESCO Award of Distinction.

#### **BJPCI Conservation Project**

The BJPCI Conservation Project in Mumbai, Maharashtra, was honored with the Award of Merit for its restoration work on a historic educational institution.

# **Historical Significance**

The BJPCI (Sir Byramjee Jeejeebhoy Parsee Charitable Institution) school building, constructed in 1908 in Gothic architectural style, has been a cornerstone of education for economically disadvantaged communities in Mumbai. The school was originally established to promote learning among the economically weaker sections of society.

#### **Restoration Work**

- The restoration of the BJPCI school building was meticulously planned and executed during the school's twomonth summer break. The project preserved the structure's architectural integrity while adapting it to meet modern safety and usability standards. The effort underscores the importance of maintaining cultural heritage while ensuring its relevance in contemporary contexts.
- UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation

#### **About the Awards**

Established in 2000, the UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation aim to recognize and promote efforts to restore, conserve, and transform structures and buildings of heritage value. The awards celebrate projects that demonstrate excellence in sustainability, technical achievements, and understanding of the cultural and historical significance of heritage sites.

#### **Selection Process**

- A **seven-member jury** of conservation practitioners specializing in architecture, archaeology, and community **development** evaluated the submissions. The winners were selected based on three main criteria:
  - 1. Understanding of Place: How well the project reflects the cultural and historical context of the site.
  - 2. Technical Achievements: The use of innovative and effective restoration techniques.
  - Sustainability and Impact: The long-term viability and community benefits of the project.

# **India Maritime Heritage Conclave 2024**

The 1st India Maritime Heritage Conclave (IMHC 2024), organized by the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW) on December 11-12, marked a significant occasion to honor India's rich maritime legacy while envisioning its future as a global maritime leader. This landmark event brought together key ministers, maritime experts, and international dignitaries, reaffirming India's crucial role in global trade and culture. The conclave also highlighted the nation's growing maritime potential, emphasizing sustainable practices and opportunities for employment and innovation in the sector.

## Historic Significance of India's Maritime Heritage


India's maritime history is embedded in ancient traditions, dating back to the Rig Veda and the Indus Valley Civilization, where maritime activities and trade played a pivotal role. The conclave explored India's enduring maritime identity, from ancient shipbuilding techniques to historical trade routes that connected the country with the rest of the world. Modern India, with its extensive coastline and strategic ports, continues to dominate global trade, handling 95% of its trade volume and 70% of its value through maritime channels.

#### **Key Highlights and Contributions**

The conclave was inaugurated by Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, with Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar and Prime Minister Narendra Modi offering messages of support. Discussions centered on making India a global maritime hub, creating employment, and preserving maritime heritage. The two-day event included keynote sessions, panel discussions, and an exhibition showcasing India's maritime techniques and trade history. Over 20 international exhibitors participated, and the event saw representation from countries like Greece, Italy, and the UK.

#### **National Maritime Heritage Complex at Lothal**

A focal point of the conclave was the upcoming National Maritime Heritage Complex (NMHC) in Lothal, Gujarat, a city with historical significance dating back to 2600 BCE. The NMHC will showcase ancient shipbuilding methods and trade techniques, celebrating India's historical contributions to global maritime practices.







#### A Vision for India's Maritime Future

The conclave also emphasized India's future trajectory as a maritime powerhouse, with discussions on sustainable blue economy practices, the creation of employment opportunities, and integrating maritime heritage into India's education system. The government's development of the NMHC is part of a broader effort to solidify India's position as a global maritime leader, combining historical legacy with forward-thinking innovation.

# **Collaboration and Participation**

The conclave was a collaborative effort, with contributions from the Ministry of Labor and Employment, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Ministry of Education, and Ministry of Tourism and Culture, alongside the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways. States like Gujarat, Goa, Bihar, and Arunachal Pradesh also played a key role, reflecting the event's national importance.

#### The New Nyaya Sanhita Mechanisms for Quick Justice Delivery

The Nyaya Sanhita, a comprehensive legislative reform, aims to expedite the justice process in India, ensuring quicker and fairer resolution of cases. The law prioritizes the completion of crucial stages of investigation and trial within specific time frames. With a focus on expediting justice for women, children, and other marginalized sections of society, the Nyaya Sanhita introduces mechanisms that tackle delays in the judicial system. These reforms aim to restore public confidence in the legal system, reduce case backlogs, and deliver justice in a timely manner.

Key Mechanisms of the Nyaya Sanhita for Quick Justice Delivery 1. Faster and Fair Resolution of Cases

- The new Nyaya Sanhita mandates strict time limits for various stages of investigation and trial.
- Preliminary Enquiry: Must be completed within 14 days.
- Further Investigation: To be completed within 90 days.
- Supply of Documents to Victim and Accused: Within 14 days.
- Commitment of Case for Trial: Within 90 days.
- Filing of Discharge Applications: Within 60 days.
- Framing of Charges: Within 60 days.
- **Pronouncement of Judgment:** Within 45 days.
- Filing of Mercy Petitions: 30 days before the Governor and 60 days before the President.
- These timeframes aim to ensure that cases progress without unnecessary delays, promoting swift justice.

# 2. Fast-Track Investigations

- The law prioritizes investigations, especially for sensitive cases such as those involving women and children.
- Investigation for Offenses Against Women and Children: Must be completed within two months of recording the information.
- This ensures that justice for vulnerable sections of society is not delayed, addressing pressing concerns about their safety and rights.

- 3. Limited Adjournments in Courts
- To curb delays in the courtroom, the Nyaya Sanhita limits adjournments.
- A maximum of two adjournments will be allowed per case.
- This mechanism ensures that cases do not get prolonged unnecessarily and prevents the legal system from becoming a vehicle for delay tactics.
- 4. Establishment of Time-Bound Procedures
- Time limits are applied to various stages, including,
- Preliminary Enquiry: 14 days Further Investigation: 90 days **Supply of Documents: 14 days Trial Commitment:** 90 days
- **Discharge Applications:** 60 days
- Charge Framing: 60 days
- **Judgment Pronouncement:** 45 days
- Mercy Petitions Filing: 30 days (Governor), 60 days (President)

# **National Affairs**

- The **Supreme Court of India** granted a **permanent** commission to Lt. Col. in the Army, who was unfairly denied the same benefits as her male counterparts. The court highlighted **gender discrimination** and ruled that the officer should have received age relaxation like others in similar positions. This ruling aligns with the broader effort to ensure equal opportunities for women in the armed forces, as seen in a 2024 verdict directing the government to grant permanent commissions to all female officers. - The 22nd Divya Kala Mela was inaugurated by Union Minister Dr. Virendra Kumar at India Gate, New Delhi from December 12-22, 2024. The event celebrates the talent and entrepreneurial spirit of Divyang artisans entrepreneurs, aiming to enhance the visibility and economic independence of persons with disabilities (PwDs). Organized by DEPwD and NDFDC, it features over 100 participants from 20 states and UTs. (Click here to read article)
- India has declared Ratapani Wildlife Sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh as its 57th tiger reserve, reinforcing its commitment to tiger conservation. This initiative is part of Project Tiger (1973), which aims to protect tigers and their habitats. India now holds over 70% of the world's wild tiger population. (Click here to read article)
- The Supreme Court Collegium, led by CJI Sanjiv Khanna, recommended the appointment of seven **Additional Judges** as Permanent Judges for the Delhi, Karnataka, and Punjab & Haryana High Courts. The appointments include Justice Shalinder Kaur and Justice Ravinder Dudeja (Delhi), Justice Ramachandra Huddar. 


#### States in the News

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has raised interest rate ceilings on FCNR(B) deposits to attract foreign capital. Banks can now offer ARR plus 400 bps for 1-3 year deposits and ARR plus 500 bps for 3-5 year deposits. 
