Women-Centric Welfare Schemes in FY25: Key Allocations and **Initiatives**

In FY25, women-centric welfare schemes collectively account for **0.5% of India's GDP,** reflecting their growing prominence in state policies and national budgets. Maharashtra leads with the largest allocation of \$5.4 billion (1.1% of its GDP), while nine states collectively allocate \$18 billion for such initiatives.

These schemes, including cash transfers and developmental programs, have emerged as pivotal political tools to attract women voters, as seen in Maharashtra's "Ladki Bahin Yojana," a significant factor in the BJP-led coalition's electoral success. Haryana proposes the highest monthly cash transfer at ₹2,100 for eligible women, impacting 1.7% of its GDP, the highest among states.

Key State-Level Initiatives

Top Allocators: Haryana, Karnataka, and West Bengal allocate substantial budgets, with schemes ranging from ₹1,000 to ₹2,100 monthly cash transfers.

Economic Impact: Haryana's scheme is projected to cost 1.7% of its GDP, while Delhi and Tamil Nadu see minimal economic strain at 0.2% and 0.4%, respectively.

Precedents: Assam (2020) and West Bengal (2021) pioneered these initiatives, with West Bengal spending \$1.7 billion (0.8% of its GDP).

National Schemes for Women Empowerment

Safety and Support: One Stop Centres (Sakhi Centres) and Women Helplines provide integrated support for violence survivors.

Rehabilitation Initiatives: The Swadhar Greh and Ujjawala **Schemes** assist women in distress and victims of trafficking.

Accommodation and Childcare: The Working Women Hostel Scheme offers safe housing and day-care facilities for employed women.

Education and Equality: The Beti Bachao Beti Padhao program addresses declining child sex ratios and promotes education for girls.

Community Empowerment: The Mahila Shakti Kendra Scheme fosters rural women's empowerment through inter-sectoral convergence.

Maternity Benefits and Umbrella Initiatives

PMMVY: This conditional cash transfer scheme provides ₹6,000 to eligible mothers for nutritional and health needs during pregnancy and lactation.

Mission Shakti: An integrated program for women's safety, security, and empowerment through convergence across governance levels and enhanced digital infrastructure.

Past and Present Context

The evolution of women-centric schemes underscores a shift from standalone welfare to integrated empowerment models. States have adopted diverse strategies with varying fiscal impacts, reflecting a balance between voter engagement and developmental goals. At the national level, initiatives aim to mainstream women's participation in governance and nationbuilding, marking a transition toward sustainable, inclusive growth.


Overview

Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 Set To Introduce in the Lok Sabha

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is set to introduce the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 in the Lok Sabha on 2nd December, 2024. The bill aims to amend several key banking-related legislations, including the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, the State Bank of India Act, 1955, and the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Acts of 1970 and 1980. The amendments are expected to enhance the functioning and regulation of the banking sector, and the bill will be considered for debate and passage in the lower house of Parliament.

Key Amendments in the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024

1. Definition of Fortnight for Cash Reserves Current Definition

 The RBI Act defines a "fortnight" as the period from Saturday to the second following Friday (including both days) to calculate the average daily balance held by scheduled banks as cash reserves.

Proposed Amendment

The Bill changes the definition of a "fortnight" to:

- The period from the 1st day to the 15th day of each month, and
- The period from the 16th day to the last day of each month.





Impact

This change also applies under the Banking Regulation Act, where non-scheduled banks are required to maintain cash reserves.

2. Tenure of Directors of Co-operative Banks **Current Rule**

Directors of co-operative banks (except the chairman or whole-time directors) cannot hold office for more than eight consecutive years.

Proposed Amendment

The Bill seeks to increase the tenure for directors of cooperative banks to 10 consecutive years.

Impact

This extension is expected to provide stability in the governance of co-operative banks.

3. Prohibition on Common Directors in Co-operative Banks Current Rule

The Banking Regulation Act prohibits a director from serving on the boards of more than one bank, with exceptions for directors appointed by the RBI.

Proposed Amendment

The Bill extends this **exemption** to the directors of central co-operative banks, allowing them to serve on the board of a state co-operative bank in which they are a member.

Impact

This aims to enhance coordination and strengthen the leadership within the co-operative banking system.

4. Substantial Interest in a Company

Current Rule


The Banking Regulation Act defines "substantial interest" as holding shares worth more than ₹5 lakh or 10% of the paidup capital, whichever is less.

Proposed Amendment

The Bill increases this threshold to ₹2 crore, allowing individuals and their families (spouse or minor children) to hold a larger stake before it is considered substantial.

Impact

This change is expected to relax restrictions on shareholding, particularly benefiting larger investors and corporate entities.



5. Nomination for Deposits and Bank Products

Current Rule

The Banking Regulation Act allows depositors to appoint a single nominee for their deposits, articles, or lockers.

Proposed Amendment

The Bill allows up to four nominees for,

- Deposits (either simultaneously or successively).
- Other items like articles and lockers (successively).

Impact

The Bill outlines that in case of simultaneous nominations, the distribution will be according to a declared proportion. For successive nominations, the person listed first in the order of nomination will have priority.

Outcome

This will facilitate the distribution of assets and clarify the rights of multiple nominees.

6. Settlement of Unclaimed Amounts

Current Rule

Under the State Bank of India Act and the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Acts of 1970 and 1980, unpaid or unclaimed dividends are transferred to an unpaid dividend account, and after seven years, they are moved to the Investor Education and Protection Fund (IEPF).

Proposed Amendment

- The Bill widens the scope of funds that can be transferred to the IEPF, now including:
- Shares for which dividends have not been claimed for seven consecutive years.
- Interest or redemption amounts for bonds that remain unpaid/unclaimed for seven years.

Impact

Individuals can claim unclaimed funds that have been transferred to the IEPF, helping to resolve outstanding claims and promote financial transparency.

7. Remuneration of Auditors

Current Rule

The remuneration for auditors of banks is decided by the RBI in consultation with the central government.

Proposed Amendment

The Bill empowers banks to determine the remuneration for their auditors independently.

Impact

This amendment is expected to streamline the process and reduce bureaucratic involvement in the auditing procedures of banks.



India Highlights Green Initiatives at UNCCD COP16 in Riyadh

India joins 197 nations at the 16th Conference of the Parties (COP) of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), which commenced on December 2, 2024, in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, marking the convention's first-ever session in West Asia. Union Minister Bhupender Yadav and Haryana Chief Minister Navab Singh Saini lead India's delegation, presenting the ambitious Aravalli Green Wall Project and showcasing India's commitment to combating desertification.

Key Highlights of UNCCD COP16

Theme and Focus: The 16th COP centers on the theme "Our Land. Our Future," emphasizing sustainable land management to reverse desertification and land degradation globally.

Historic Context: The UNCCD, one of the three agreements from the 1992 Rio Earth Summit, entered into force in 1996 and includes 197 parties. The conference occurs biennially, with COP15 held in May 2022 in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire.

India's Role at COP16

"Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" Initiative: Minister Yadav planted a sapling at the Indian Embassy in Riyadh under India's "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" campaign, advocating for eco-consciousness.

Mission Life Engagement: He encouraged Indian students to adopt sustainable practices through Mission LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment).

Aravalli Green Wall Project: India is presenting this flagship initiative aimed at restoring 1.15 million hectares of degraded land across four states, signaling its proactive stance on environmental restoration.

Significance of the UNCCD

Global Goals: The UNCCD aims to achieve land degradation neutrality (LDN) under the Changwon Initiative launched in 2011, with over 120 countries committing to LDN targets.

Scientific Approach: The convention promotes reclaiming degraded lands using innovative scientific methods.

Connections with Other Environmental Summits of 2024

UNFCCC COP29: Held in Baku, Azerbaijan (November 11-22), focusing on global warming and the Paris Agreement targets.


CBD COP16: The biodiversity summit started in Cali, Colombia, but was postponed due to quorum issues and will resume in Rome in February 2025.

Monetary Policy Meeting Dec 2024

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) conducted its latest bi-monthly Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting in December 2024. Governor Shaktikanta Das announced several crucial measures and projections to address current economic challenges while maintaining stability. Here's a detailed breakdown:

CRR Cut by 50 Basis Points to 4%

To tackle liquidity concerns, the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) was reduced by 50 basis points to 4%. This move aligns with the RBI's neutral policy stance, aimed at ensuring economic stability without disruptive interventions.



RBI Monetary

Policy Meeting Dec 2024: Key Highlights

Repo Rate Unchanged at 6.5%

The MPC decided by a 4-2 majority to maintain the reporate at **6.5%.** The Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) rate and the Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) rate were also retained at 6.25% and 6.75%, respectively. This cautious approach reflects the central bank's focus on balancing inflation and growth.

GDP Growth Forecast Lowered for FY25

The RBI revised the GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 6.6%, down from the earlier projection of 7.2%. Governor Das attributed the adjustment to weaker-than-expected Q2 growth and specific challenges in the manufacturing sector. Despite this, highfrequency indicators suggest potential stabilization ahead.

Inflation Projections for FY25

The RBI forecasted an inflation rate of 4.8% for FY25. Food inflation is expected to persist during Q3 but may ease from Q4 onward. Quarterly projections are as follows:

- Q3 FY25: 5.7%
- Q4 FY25: 4.5%
- Q1 FY26: 4.6%
- Q2 FY26: 4.0%





Support for the Agricultural Sector

In a significant move, the RBI increased the collateral limit for agricultural loans from Rs 1.6 lakh crore per borrower to Rs 2 lakh crore. This aims to enhance financial support for farmers and boost credit availability in the sector.

Introduction of SORR Benchmark

The RBI proposed a new benchmark, the Secured Overnight Rupee Rate (SORR), to strengthen market-based pricing mechanisms and enhance transparency in monetary operations.

New Communication Initiative: RBI Podcasts

The RBI plans to launch podcasts as a communication tool to improve public engagement and transparency. This initiative reflects the central bank's commitment to leveraging technology for better outreach.

Measures to Attract Foreign Capital

To boost foreign investments, the RBI raised interest rate ceilings on FCNR-B deposits and increased FCNR deposit rates. These measures aim to attract higher foreign portfolio inflows, which have totaled \$9.3 billion so far in FY25.

Addressing Unclaimed Deposits

The RBI directed banks to segregate unclaimed deposit accounts using Direct Benefit Transfers (DBT). This step aims to ensure transparency and efficiency in beneficiary identification while facilitating the seamless flow of DBT funds.

Challenges in Domestic Consumption

Private consumption growth slowed to 6% in the September quarter from 7.5% earlier, reflecting a decline in urban demand. Fixed investment growth also dipped to 5.4%. However, government consumption rebounded by 4.4%, driven by election-related activities.

These measures and insights reflect the RBI's balanced approach to addressing economic challenges while fostering growth and stability. The central bank continues to monitor developments closely, ensuring proactive and effective policymaking.

National Affairs

The New Pamban Bridge, India's first vertical lift railway sea bridge, is replacing the 105-year-old Pamban Bridge to improve connectivity between the Indian mainland and Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu. The 2.05 km bridge, costing Rs **535 crore**, features a fully automated vertical lift span for **22** meters of air clearance for ships. Designed for double tracks and high-speed trains, it began construction in February 2020, with completion expected by June 30, 2024, after delays due to the pandemic. The original bridge was

- decommissioned in December 2022.(Click here to read article)
- The Ministry of Ayush, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has transformed into a global leader in traditional medicine since its inception in 2014. Key achievements include over 755,780 registered practitioners, 886 undergraduate and 251 postgraduate colleges, and 3,844 hospitals with 36,848 dispensaries. The Ministry has also expanded infrastructure with satellite centers of AIIA, NIUM, and NIH, adding 400 education seats and 550 beds. aligning with UN SDGs and Universal Health Coverage. - (Pro-Active PRAGATI Governance and Timely Implementation), launched under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has transformed India's infrastructure development. The platform fosters accountability and collaboration between federal and regional authorities, accelerating delayed projects. A study by Oxford University and the Gates Foundation highlights its impact, overseeing \$205 billion worth of projects. (Click here to read article)
- India's tiger population has grown significantly, reaching 3,682 in 2022, up from 1,411 in 2006, reflecting a 6% annual increase in monitored areas. This growth is attributed to conservation efforts under Project Tiger and the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). Key regional trends include a rise in Central India and Eastern Ghats (1,033 to 1,439), Shivalik-Gangetic Plains (646 to 819), and Sundarbans (88 to 101), while Northeastern India saw a decline, particularly in Arunachal Pradesh (29 to 9). - Ratapani Tiger Reserve, located in Madhya Pradesh, has been officially designated as India's 57th Tiger Reserve. Spanning 1,271.4 sq km, it includes a 763.8 sq km core area and a 507.6 sq km buffer area. This move strengthens India's commitment to tiger conservation and reinforces Madhya Pradesh's status as the "Tiger State of India".

- The National Legal Metrology Portal (eMaap), introduced by the Indian government, aims to ensure fair trade and consumer protection by promoting transparency and compliance with metrology standards. The digital platform will streamline registration, certification, and provide automated workflows for businesses. It also focuses on consumer awareness and grievance redressal for measurement issues. - India has declared snakebite a notifiable disease, aiming to reduce the high mortality and morbidity rates, particularly in rural and tribal areas. This move, announced by the Union Health Ministry in November 2024, mandates reporting of all snakebite cases in healthcare facilities. It aligns with the WHO's target to halve global snakebite deaths and injuries by 2030, enhancing surveillance, treatment, and prevention strategies. (Click here to read article)



- Shri Pralhad Joshi, Union Minister, launched Anna Chakra and the SCAN portal to modernize India's Public Distribution System (PDS) and subsidy claim mechanisms. Anna Chakra aims to optimize the PDS supply chain for efficient food grain movement, while **SCAN** streamlines subsidy claims under the National Food Security Act (NFSA) with single-window submission, automation, and rulebased processing for faster subsidy release. - The Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) scheme, launched in 2015, has improved the Sex Ratio at Birth (SRB) from 918 in 2014-15 to 930 in 2023-24 and raised the **Gross Enrollment** Ratio (GER) for girls at the secondary level from 75.51% to 79.4%. The scheme focuses on eliminating gender-biased practices, promoting girl child protection, and education. It is centrally funded under the Mission Shakti Sambal vertical, with funds allocated based on SRB data. However, West Bengal has not implemented the scheme. (Click here to read
- The Bharatiya Vayuyan Vidheyak, 2024 replaces the 90year-old Aircraft Act of 1934, modernizing India's aviation regulations. Passed by **Parliament**, it aims to enhance safety, affordability, governance, and consumer protection while promoting investment and self-reliance in aircraft manufacturing. The bill also seeks to streamline processes and align with international standards. The renaming in **Hindi** reflects the government's goal to promote **indigenous** identity despite sparking debates. (Click here to read article)
- The **SMILE** sub-scheme, a **central government initiative**, aims to rehabilitate individuals, including **children**, involved in begging. Implemented across 81 cities in 26 states and UTs, it focuses on areas with significant religious, historical, or tourist importance. The scheme supports reintegration of marginalized individuals into society. (Click here to read article)
- India has been chosen to chair the 68th Session of the UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND), marking its first time in this role. Ambassador Shambhu S Kumaran assumed the chairmanship, overseeing global drug policy international cooperation on drug control. The CND monitors drug trends, advises member states, and oversees international drug conventions, functioning under United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), based in Vienna, and is a functional commission of the **UN Economic** and Social Council (ECOSOC). States in the News

The Uttar Pradesh government has declared the Maha Kumbh area in Prayagraj as the new Maha Kumbh Mela district ahead of the January 2025 Kumbh Mela. This move aims to improve administration, coordination, law enforcement, and resource management for the event, which attracts millions of pilgrims. (Click here to read article)

- Telangana has joined India's mineral auction regime, auctioning two limestone blocks in Sultanpur and Saidulnama to NCL Industries and Deccan Cement. This makes Telangana the 14th state to participate, responding to the Centre's push for auctioning critical minerals. The state's move aims to boost mineral production for industries like cement manufacturing, with more auctions expected. (Click here to read article)
- Mission Arun Himveer has been launched by the Arunachal Pradesh Government to improve market access for local farmers, SHGs, FPOs, and cooperatives. The Arunachal Pradesh Agriculture Marketing Board (APAMB) signed an MoU with ITBP to purchase fruits, vegetables, meat, and **poultry** directly from farmers. This initiative aims to boost economic growth in rural areas, support the Vibrant Village Programme, and promote reverse migration. A ₹4 crore revolving fund will ensure farmers receive 100% payments. (Click here to read article)
- West Bengal has gained international recognition with **UNESCO** declaring it a top destination for **heritage tourism**. Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee highlighted the state's growth in religious, heritage, and tea tourism, driving job creation for youth. - Uber has launched Asia's first water transport service, Uber Shikara, in Dal Lake, Srinagar, Jammu and Kashmir. - Devendra Fadnavis has been elected as the leader of the Maharashtra BJP legislature party, paving the way for his third term as Chief Minister. Alongside him, Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar will serve as deputy chief ministers. 
