

- 7th Future Food Forum 2025 opened in Dubai, hosted by the UAE Food & Beverage Business Group, focusing on food security, sustainability, CEPAs, and agri-tech innovation, with UAE targeting \$10.9 bn food sector.
- The 28th National Conference on e-Governance (NCeG) in Visakhapatnam adopted the Visakhapatnam Declaration 2025, stressing AI, cybersecurity, digital inclusion, and civil service transformation, aligning with the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047.
- World Food India 2025 (25-28 Sept) at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, inaugurated by PM Modi, will host 1700+ exhibitors, 500+ global buyers, 100+ countries, promoting sustainability, innovation, and inclusivity in food systems.

## **Ranks and Reports**

The Government of India, through the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI), released the Forest Accounts 2025 on 25 September 2025 during the 29th CoCSSO in Chandigarh, based on the UN SEEA framework. The report highlights that India's forest cover rose by 17,444.61 sq. km between 2010-11 and 2021-22, now covering 21.76% of the country's land area, with the highest gains in Kerala, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu. The growing stock of usable wood increased by 305.53 million cubic meters (7.32%), led by Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, and the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. The Provisioning Services value of timber and nontimber products rose to ₹37,930 crore in 2021-22, while Regulating Services like carbon retention surged by 51.82% to ₹6.20 lakh crore, contributing 2.63% of GDP. With statelevel trends and valuation models, the report underscores forests' dual role in economic growth and climate regulation, supporting India's net-zero 2070 target.





The Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) released the fourth edition of its flagship report Children in India 2025 on 25 September 2025 during the CoCSSO conference in Chandigarh. Divided into seven chapters, the publication covers health, nutrition, education, child protection, and SDGs, while also introducing new indicators like digital device usage, adoption statistics, and causes of child deaths. Key findings include a sharp decline in Infant Mortality Rate from 44 (2011) to 25 (2023), a fall in dropout rates at all school levels (secondary level at 8.2% in 2024-25), and achievement of gender parity in education, with girls outnumbering boys in secondary schooling (GPI 1.1). The report also records a drop in child marriage (23.3% women married before 18 in 2019-21 vs 26.8% in 2015-16), and notes 4,515 adoptions in 2024-25, mostly in-country and predominantly of female children. By offering consolidated, QR-linked datasets, the report provides a robust evidence base for child-focused policies and SDG monitoring.

- Busquets Announces Retirement: Spanish football legend Sergio Busquets retires after illustrious 20-year career, concluding with Inter Miami in 2025.

#### **Schemes and Committees News**

- PM Modi launched Mukhyamantri Mahila Rojgar Yojana (26 Sept 2025) in Bihar, transferring ₹10,000 each to 75 lakh women via DBT (₹7,500 crore), with scope of ₹2 lakh support per woman through SHGs and Jeevika Nidhi. The scheme complements the Lakhpati Didi Campaign, aiming for 3 crore self-reliant women entrepreneurs nationwide; Bihar to contribute the highest share of Lakhpati Didis.
- India celebrated 11 years of Make in India (25 Sept 2014–2025), boosting FDI, manufacturing, exports (crossed \$450 bn in FY24), job creation, and aligning with Aatmanirbhar Bharat & PLI schemes, though manufacturing share is ~17% of GDP. Global majors like Apple, Samsung, Boeing, Tesla expanded Indian manufacturing under Make in India, while exports of engineering goods, electronics, chemicals led growth despite challenges in land, logistics, and labour reforms.
- Cabinet approved DSIR's CBHRD scheme with an outlay of ₹2,277.397 crore (2021–26) under CSIR, supporting doctoral/postdoctoral fellowships, Bhatnagar Fellowships, research grants, and awards to strengthen India's STEMM workforce. The CBHRD scheme aims to nurture young researchers, empower senior scientists, and improve India's global innovation ranking (39th in 2024), building a strong R&D ecosystem for sustainable growth.
- Bihar Women Empowerment Scheme: PM Modi launches direct cash transfer program providing ₹10,000 to 75 lakh women in Bihar to promote self-employment opportunities.
