



Weekly One Liners 20th to 26th of October 2025

National Affairs

- The Law Ministry raised notary limits in Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, and Nagaland under the Notaries (Amendment) Rules, 2025, effective from October 17, 2025, to meet growing legal service demands.
- The Union Government released ₹730 crore under the 15th Finance Commission grants to Gujarat and Haryana for strengthening Rural Local Bodies. Gujarat received ₹522.2 crore, Haryana got ₹195.13 crore, aimed at improving sanitation, water supply, and local governance.
- India ranks 9th in total forest area and 3rd in annual forest gain, as per GFRA 2025 (FAO). The rise reflects the success of afforestation policies, campaigns like 'Ek Ped Ma Ke Naam', and strong community participation.
- NHAI will deploy Al-driven 3D laser Network Survey Vehicles (NSVs) across 23 states to detect road defects and improve highway maintenance.
- Sacred 'Jore Sahib' Yatra Begins: The sacred footwear of Guru Gobind Singh and Mata Sahib Kaur, preserved for over 300 years by Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri's family, embarked on the Guru Charan Yatra from Delhi to Takht Sri Patna Sahib (October 23 - November 1, 2025), passing through Faridabad, Agra, Lucknow, and Varanasi before permanent enshrinement.
- India Launches National Drug Licensing System: Following tragic cough syrup deaths, India's CDSCO launched the Online National Drug Licensing System (ONDLS) to digitally monitor pharmaceutical solvents with real-time batch tracking and strict verification to prevent toxic contamination like diethylene glycol in medicines.

States in the News

- The Bathou religion of Assam's Bodo community received a separate code in the upcoming Census, recognizing it as a distinct faith.
- Manipur celebrates Ningol Chakouba, a festival strengthening brother-sister bonds, with a grand fish curry feast and cultural events.
- Andhra Pradesh CM Naidu visits UAE to promote green energy, digital infrastructure, and secured a ₹100 crore donation for a public library.
- Kerala will be declared extreme poverty-free by Nov 1, 2025, due to successful poverty eradication and strong social programs.
- Chennai launched a Real-Time Flood Forecasting system over key river basins, enhancing flood preparedness with World Bank support.

- Centre proposes applying Article 371 in Ladakh to safeguard local laws and culture amidst ongoing statehood discussions.
- Ayodhya Creates Guinness Records: Uttar Pradesh set two Guinness World Records at Deepotsav 2025 by lighting 26,17,215 oil lamps along the Saryu River and assembling 2,128 priests and devotees for a simultaneous Maa Saryu Aarti, featuring laser shows, Ram Leela performances, and drone displays.
- Maharashtra Beaches Get Blue Flag Certification: Five Maharashtra beaches—Shrivardhan, Nagaon, Parnaka, Guhagar, and Ladghar—earned the prestigious international Blue Flag certification from Denmark's Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE), meeting 33 strict criteria on cleanliness, sustainability, water quality, and safety.
- Kerala Plans First Underwater Tunnel: Kerala will build its first underwater tunnel connecting Vypin and Fort Kochi, reducing travel distance from 16 km to 3 km beneath the Arabian Sea, with the ₹2,672 crore twin-tube tunnel (2.75 km long, 35 meters below sea level) expected to be completed by September 2027.

International Affairs

- The U.S. and Australia signed an \$8.5 billion critical minerals deal to reduce dependence on China and strengthen supply chains, focusing on lithium, nickel, and rare earths.
- India and Brazil formed a strategic trade and technology alliance, aiming to boost bilateral cooperation and economic growth.
- Sanae Takaichi became Japan's first female Prime Minister, pledging to revive Abenomics-style economic reforms and strengthen Japan's global standing.







- India upgraded its Technical Mission in Kabul to a full Embassy, showing commitment to Afghanistan's development. EAM Jaishankar pledged support in healthcare, terrorism cooperation, and development projects.
- Rodrigo Paz won the Bolivian presidential election with 54.5% votes, ending 20 years of socialist rule. He promotes market reforms, tax cuts, and economic stabilization amid a deep economic crisis.
- To counter rising crime, President Jose Jeri declared a 30day emergency in Lima and Callao, allowing armed forces to assist police in restoring public order.
- Saudi Arabia ended the exploitative Kafala system, granting migrant workers job freedom and improved legal rights.
- New Zealand plans to ban social media for under-16s, requiring age verification to protect youth from mental health risks.
- Tuvalu Joins IUCN as 90th Member: Tuvalu became the 90th State Member of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), gaining access to a global network to combat climate change, sea-level rise, and biodiversity loss while strengthening conservation efforts in its vast marine-rich Exclusive Economic Zone.

Agreements/MoUs Signed

- Coal India and IIT Madras signed an MoU to create a Sustainable Energy Centre focusing on clean energy and low-carbon technologies.
- Government of India (GOI) partnered with the Government
 of Nigeria to establish the first Indian Institute of
 Technology (IIT) campus in Nigeria, marking a significant
 step in bilateral collaboration in the field of education.

Books and Authors

- Union Minister Rajnath Singh, Ministry of Defence(MoD), released the book titled "Civil-Military Fusion as a Metric of National Power and Comprehensive Security", authored by Lieutenant General (Lt Gen) Raj Shukla (Retired) at the event held at the United Service Institution of India (USI) in New Delhi, Delhi.
- Maharashtra Chief Minister Governor Acharya Devvrat released a book titled "Modi's Mission" authored by Berjis Desai, a renowned lawyer and former journalist, at an event held in Mumbai, Maharashtra.

Banking/Economy/Business News

- India's retail sector clocked ₹5.4 lakh crore in goods and ₹65,000 crore in services sales during Navratri to Diwali, a 25% increase over last year, driven by GST rate cuts on key items.
- India's net FDI fell 159% in August 2025, reflecting higher outflows than inflows but remains above last year's total.
- In October 2025, Ageas Federal Life Insurance Company Limited (AFLIC) partnered with CSB Bank Limited in a Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) Bancassurance tie-up to provide life insurance solutions to SMEs and individual entrepreneurs across India.
- In October 2025, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has signed a USD 3 billion sovereign Exposure Exchange Agreement (EEA) with the World Bank (WB) to increase the lending capacity of ADB for its developing member nations.
- Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)-constituted working group headed by Rama Subramaniam(R.S) Gandhi, former Deputy Governor of Reserve Bank of India (RBI), has proposed increasing transaction charges for clearing corporations such as NSE Clearing Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary of the National Stock Exchange (NSE). However, SEBI clarified that broker charges will remain unchanged.
- New Nomination Rules Effective November 1: Key nomination provisions under the Banking Laws (Amendment) Act, 2025 will take effect from November 1, allowing bank customers to make up to four nominations for deposit accounts, safe custody items, and safety lockers with simultaneous or successive nomination options.
- Payments Corporation of India introduced "UPI Help," an Al-powered assistant integrated with the UDIR dispute resolution framework to provide real-time support for payment queries, mandate management, and grievance redressal, initially available via select bank portals and DigiSaathi chatbot.
- UPI Introduces Mutual Fund Payment Feature: India's UPI launched the 'Pay With Mutual Fund' feature allowing users to make real-time payments directly from liquid mutual fund holdings (supported by ICICI Prudential and Bajaj Finserv AMC), offering instant liquidity and 6-7% potential returns without transferring funds to bank accounts first.
- SBI Wins Global Finance Awards: State Bank of India received two Global Finance awards—'World's Best Consumer Bank 2025' and 'Best Bank in India 2025'— recognizing its excellence in innovation and customer service while serving 520 million customers and adding 65,000 new users daily through its flagship mobile app.







- Adani's Godda Plant Gets Grid Connection Approval: Government of India approved Adani Power Limited's 1,600 MW Godda Ultra Super Critical Thermal Power Plant in Jharkhand for national grid connection via Line-In Line-Out arrangement, allowing the Bangladesh-export plant to supply power domestically with 25-year validity.
- Deloitte Forecasts 6.7-6.9% GDP Growth: Deloitte India projects India's GDP growth at 6.7-6.9% in FY26, driven by strong domestic demand, policy reforms, and low inflation that boosts consumer spending, aligned with RBI's 6.8% estimate despite global trade uncertainties and core inflation above 4%.

Appointments/Resignations

- Former Accenture CTO Karthik Narain appointed Google Cloud's Chief Product and Business Officer to drive AI and
- Olympic medallist Neeraj Chopra was conferred honorary rank of Lieutenant Colonel in the Territorial Army.
- Delhi High Court Judge Prathiba Singh appointed as Chair of WIPO Advisory Board of Judges for 2025-27.

Defence News

- Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated a ₹1,000 crore Titanium and Superalloy Plant in Lucknow to boost India's self-reliance in defense materials.
- INS Sahyadri joined the India-Japan Maritime Exercise (JAIMEX 25) in Yokosuka from October 16–17, along with Japanese naval and air forces. The exercise aims to enhance tactical cooperation and regional stability, highlighting the growing defense ties under the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership.
- Indian Army forms 25 Bhairav Battalions, elite units for rapid strikes, counter-insurgency, and cross-border operations.



The Indian Air Force (IAF) is participating in 'Ocean Sky 2025', a multinational air combat exercise which is being hosted by the Spanish Air Force from October 20 to October 31, 2025 at Gando Air Base in the Canary Islands in Spain.

Awards and Recognitions

- Masako Nozawa, known for voicing Son Goku in Dragon Ball, became the first voice actor to receive Japan's prestigious Person of Cultural Merit award for her decades-long contribution to anime and culture.
- The SAIME model from Sundarbans won FAO Global Recognition for promoting sustainable shrimp farming, mangrove conservation, and climate-adaptive livelihoods.
- 4th edition of Global Fintech Awards (GFA 2025) were announced during the Global Fintech Fest(GFF 2025) held at Jio World Centre (JWC) in Mumbai(Maharashtra), honoring outstanding trailblazers for their exceptional contributions to the fintech ecosystem.
- Ministry of Women and Child Development (MoWCD), has been awarded for its exceptional contribution towards the implementation of the Pradhan Mantri - Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM-JANMAN) scheme.
- In October 2025, Indian-origin historian Sunil Amrith has won the 2025 British Academy Book Prize for the book-"The Burning Earth: An Environmental History of the Last 500 Years".
- Sunil Amrith Wins British Academy Prize: Indian-origin historian Sunil Amrith won the 2025 British Academy Book Prize (worth £25,000) for "The Burning Earth: An Environmental History of the Last 500 Years," tracing five centuries of environmental change shaped by colonization, industrialization, and human activity.

Summits and Conferences News

- At the 8th Codex Committee session, standards for vanilla, large cardamom, and coriander were finalized. The Codex panel, led by India, now covers 19 spices, ensuring food safety and fair trade globally.
- Union Minister of State(MoS) Jitin Prasada, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology(MeitY) and Ministry of Commerce and Industry(MoC&I) inaugurated the Uttarakhand Al Impact Summit 2025 at Dehradun, Uttarakhand. The summit united policymakers, industry leaders, startups, and academia to explore Al's role in sustainable development, governance, and entrepreneurship.





Ranks and Reports

- The Mines Ministry launched the State Mining Readiness Index (SMRI) to assess and rank states on mineral governance and transparency; Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Gujarat led among mineral-rich states.
- On October 21, 2025, Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations (UN) released a report titled "Global Forest Resource Assessment (GFRA) 2025". As per the report, India ranks 9th globally with 72.74 million hectares (Mha) of forest cover, representing 2% of the world's total forests, up from 10th in the previous assessment. Russian Federation ranks first globally with 832.6 Mha, accounting for 20% of the world's forests, followed by Brazil(486.08 Mha) and Canada(368.81 Mha).

Sports News

- Morocco defeated Argentina 2-0 to win their first-ever U-20 World Cup, becoming the first African team since 2009 to do so.
- Max Verstappen won the US Grand Prix, narrowing the championship gap to 40 points and intensifying the F1 title race
- Goa CM unveiled the official logo and anthem of the FIDE World Cup 2025 chess tournament hosted in Goa. Anthem: 'It's Your Move' by Daler Mehndi. The logo is designed to reflect Goa's identity and the spirit of chess. It consists of three trapezoidal panels.
- The 11th edition of the World Para Powerlifting Championships 2025 was held at Cairo, Egypt from 11 to 18 October 2025, marking the first-ever World Championships held in Africa. The event took place at the Egypt International Olympic Games City, New Administrative Capital, with 537 athletes from 70 countries, including all Paralympic champions from the Paris 2024 Games. China claimed its fifth consecutive and sixth overall title as the leading nation in Para Powerlifting.
- Indian Junior Men's Hockey Team clinched a Silver Medal after losing narrowly by 2-1 to Australia in the final match of the 13th edition of Sultan of Johor Cup held at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru(JB), Malaysia. This marked India's 5th Silver at the Sultan of Johor Cup after 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2019.
- Indian former sport shooter and Olympic Gold medalist Abhinav Bindra appointed as torchbearer for the Milano Cortina 2026 Winter Olympics, scheduled to be held from February 6 to 22, 2026, in Milan and Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy.
- Morocco national football team clinched the International Federation of Association Football (FIFA) U-20 World Cup title by defeating Argentina national football team by 2-0 in the final match held at Estadio Nacional Julio Martinez Pradanos in Santiago, Chile.

- India Re-Elected Vice-Chair of Anti-Doping Bureau: India
 was re-elected as Vice-Chairperson of the COP10 Bureau
 for 2025-2027 at the 10th Session of the International
 Convention against Doping in Sport held in Paris,
 participating with over 190 nations and contributing to
 discussions on governance, compliance, and emerging
 challenges like gene manipulation.
- Rohit Sharma Becomes India's 3rd-Highest ODI Scorer:
 Rohit Sharma surpassed Sourav Ganguly to become India's third-highest ODI run-getter with 11,249 runs in 275 matches including 32 centuries, scoring a steady 73 runs off 97 balls in the second ODI against Australia, trailing only Sachin Tendulkar (18,426 runs) and Virat Kohli (14,181 runs).

Schemes and Committees News

- The UDAN scheme, launched in 2016, completed 9 years, enabling 1.56 crore passengers through 649 routes. It enhanced regional connectivity, with future plans to target hilly and NE regions, including 30 water aerodromes.
- Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (DoAFW), Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (MoAFW), revised the guidelines for 'Per Drop More Crop (PDMC) scheme', with an aim to promote efficient water use and raise the income of farmers. The revised guidelines enable more flexibility for States and Union Territories (UTs) to take up micro-level water storage and conservation projects under the "Other Interventions" (OI) category.
- IndiaAl Mission under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO), announced a global call for abstracts on impactful applications(app) of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in health systems.
- Kerala Government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Central Government (CG) for the Prime Minister's Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI) Scheme, a national initiative aimed at improving the quality of education in government schools.

Science and Technology News

- ISRO's Chandrayaan-2 detected how solar storms (CMEs) affect the Moon's exosphere, providing new insights into lunar space weather.
- India developed its first indigenous antibiotic
 'Nafithromycin' and achieved success in gene therapy for Hemophilia, marking a major biotech milestone.
- OpenAl launched ChatGPT Atlas, an Al browser for macOS with contextual help, memory, and Agent mode that can act on commands (e.g., filling forms). Windows and mobile versions coming soon.





- India and the UK have launched the Ramanujan Junior Researchers Programme, a DST-backed research fellowship allowing young Indian physicists and mathematicians to conduct joint research at the London Institute for Mathematical Sciences (LIMS).
- India has surpassed \$20 billion in cumulative and new AI investment commitments as of 2025, marking a major step towards becoming a global AI leader.


Important Days News

- World Menopause Day is observed every year on October 18th to raise awareness about menopause and support options for women's health. 2025 Theme: "Lifestyle Medicine in Menopausal Health"
- World Osteoporosis Day (WOD) is observed every year across the globe on October 20 to raise global awareness of the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of Osteoporosis and metabolic bone disease. 2025 theme: "It's Unacceptable!"
- National Solidarity Day is observed every year on October 20 in India to honour soldiers who died in the 1962 Indo-China War, which started on October 20, 1962, and ended on November 21, 1962.
- Global Iodine Deficiency Disorder (IDD) Prevention Day or World Iodine Day is observed annually across the globe on October 21 to create awareness about iodine and its usage among the people.
- Bandi Chhor Divas, celebrated on October 21, 2025, marks
 Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji's release and symbolizes freedom and justice.
- Police Commemoration Day, observed on October 21, honors the 1959 sacrifice of 10 policemen killed in Ladakh by Chinese troops. Held at the National Police Memorial in New Delhi, it features tributes, parades, and ceremonies.
- Bestu Varas, the Gujarati New Year, falls on 22 October 2025, a day after Diwali. It marks new business beginnings and spiritual renewal, celebrated with Chopda Pujan, temple visits, and "Saal Mubarak" greetings.
- Govardhan Puja, celebrated after Diwali, commemorates Lord Krishna lifting Govardhan Hill. Devotees offer Chappan Bhog, perform Parikrama, and worship cow dung replicas of the hill.
- World Snow Leopard Day (WSLD), also known as International Snow Leopard Day, is observed globally on 23rd October each year to raise awareness about the conservation of the Snow Leopard (Panthera uncia). 2025 Theme: "Protecting the Mountain Guardian"
- Every year, 24th October is celebrated as United Nations
 Day across the world. The day marks the anniversary of the
 establishment of the United Nations Organisation (UNO)
 in 1945. It serves as a reminder of the UN's continuous
 efforts toward global peace, human rights, and
 sustainable development.

- World Polio Day is observed every year on 24 October to raise awareness about the global fight against polio, a contagious viral disease that can cause permanent paralysis and even death. In 2025, the observance carries the theme "End Polio: Every Child, Every Vaccine, Everywhere," emphasizing the urgent need to ensure that every child—regardless of location or circumstance receives life-saving polio vaccinations.
- World Development Information Day is observed every year on 24th October, the same day as United Nations Day, to emphasize the vital role of information and communication technology (ICT) in driving global development and solving challenges faced by nations.
- ITBP Raising Day is observed every year on 24th October to commemorate the formation of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) a specialized force that guards the Indo-China border across some of the most challenging terrains on earth. The ITBP Raising Day 2025 marks 63 years of dedicated service, celebrating the courage, discipline, and resilience of personnel who protect India's borders at altitudes often exceeding 14,000 feet.
