



### PM Narendra Modi's Visit to South Africa for the 20th **G20 Summit**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 2025 visit Johannesburg marked a significant moment in India-Africa relations and the evolution of the G20. Hosted by South African President Cyril Ramaphosa, the summit focused on strengthening global solidarity, reforming financial institutions, and advancing sustainable development.

The visit also featured important announcements, new partnerships, and several bilateral meetings with world leaders.

#### PM Narendra Modi Arrived in South Africa

PM Modi arrived at Waterkloof Air Force Base on November 21, 2025, where he received a ceremonial welcome.

This was his fourth official visit to South Africa, following his 2016 bilateral visit and participation in BRICS Summits in 2018 and 2023.

#### Highlights of the 2025 G20 Summit

#### Theme and Participation

The 2025 G20 Summit, held on November 22-23, was based on the theme "Solidarity, Equality, Sustainability."

Leaders from 19 member countries, the European Union, and major global bodies such as the UN, IMF, World Bank, WTO, WHO, OECD, and ILO attended the summit.

The United States did not participate.

#### PM Narendra Modi's Addresses at the Summit

Opening Session: "Inclusive and Sustainable Economic Growth - Leaving No One Behind"

#### PM Modi highlighted:

- The need to reform development financing
- The importance of inclusive and sustainable growth
- Enhancing the voice of the Global South
- Second Session: "A Resilient World"

#### He called for:

- Stronger global climate action
- Safeguarding global food security
- Third Session: "A Fair and Just Future for All"

# He proposed:

- A Global Framework for Talent Mobility
- Cooperation on critical minerals
- Decent work standards
- Responsible and inclusive expansion of AI

He also announced that India would host the AI Impact Summit in February 2026 under the theme "Sarvajanam Hitaya, Sarvajanam Sukhaya."

#### Six Key Ideas Proposed by PM Modi

PM Modi put forward six major initiatives:

#### 1. G20 Global Traditional Knowledge Repository

A global database to preserve and utilize traditional knowledge.

#### 2. G20 Africa Skills Multiplier

Training one million certified trainers to build long-term skilling capacity across Africa.

#### 3. G20 Global Health Response Team

A rapid-response team of experts for global health emergencies.

#### 4. G20 Open Satellite Data Partnership

Sharing satellite data with developing countries for agriculture, disaster management, and fisheries.

#### 5. G20 Critical Minerals Circularity Initiative

Promoting recycling, urban mining, and reuse to strengthen mineral supply chains.

#### 6. G20 Initiative on Countering the Drug-Terror Nexus

A coordinated global effort to disrupt drug trafficking and terror financing.

#### G20 Adopted a 122-Point Joint Leaders' Declaration

G20 countries adopted a comprehensive 122-Point Leaders' **Declaration** emphasizing:

- Climate Action and Sustainability
- Debt Relief and Development Financing
- Critical Minerals
- Trade and Multilateralism
- Peace and Security
- Support for Vulnerable Countries
- Reforms of Global Governance

#### Major Outcomes of the 2025 G20 Summit

#### **♦ IMF Reform**

The Summit approved a 25th IMF Executive Board seat for Sub-Saharan Africa, enhancing the region's representation.

#### Mission 300

Leaders launched Mission 300, aimed at providing electricity access to 300 million Africans by 2030.







#### Renewable Energy Goals

Members agreed to:

- Triple global renewable energy capacity by 2030
- Double global energy efficiency by 2030
- Critical Minerals

A Critical Minerals Framework was adopted for sustainable mining and resilient supply chains.

Food Security

The **Ubuntu Approaches** on food security were **introduced**, supporting small farmers, local agriculture, and price stability.

Al for Africa

The G20 launched the AI for Africa Initiative, strengthening digital talent, data access, and computing infrastructure.

#### **ACITI Partnership Launched**

India, Canada, and Australia announced the ACITI Partnership (Australia-Canada-India Technology & Innovation Partnership). This trilateral initiative **focused on**:

- Critical and emerging technologies
- Green energy innovation
- Resilient supply chains, including critical minerals
- Al for public good

#### Bilateral Meetings Held by PM Modi

On the sidelines of the summit, PM Modi met several world leaders:

#### South Africa

He met President Cyril Ramaphosa and reviewed cooperation in trade, mining, skills, and investment.

#### Canada

He met Prime Minister Mark Carney and discussed expanding ties in defence, trade, space, and technology.

Both sides agreed to resume CEPA negotiations, aiming to double trade to USD 50 billion by 2030.

#### Japan

In his first meeting with PM Sanae Takaichi, both leaders reviewed progress under the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership (SSGP).

#### Italy

PM Modi met Italy's PM Giorgia Meloni, and both countries adopted the India-Italy Joint Initiative to Counter Terror **Financing**, strengthening cooperation in FATF and GCTF.

#### **IBSA Leaders' Meeting**

PM Modi attended the IBSA Leaders' Meeting with leaders from Brazil and South Africa.

#### He proposed:

An IBSA Digital Innovation Alliance featuring UPI, CoWIN, cybersecurity exchanges, and women-led tech models.

An IBSA Fund for Climate-Resilient Agriculture to boost South-South cooperation.

#### **Key Global Outcomes and Initiatives**

#### 1. Belem Package Adopted

COP30, with participation from 195 countries, adopted the Belem Package, a set of 29 decisions covering:

- Adaptation finance
- Just transition
- Technology support
- Gender and climate
- Trade, mitigation, and implementation

#### **Commitment:**

Countries agreed to double adaptation finance by 2025 and triple it by 2035.

#### 2. ARISE Programme Launched

The Climate Investment Fund (CIF) launched the ARISE (Accelerating Resilience Investments and Innovations for Sustainable Economies) initiative.

Support Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Small Island **Developing States (SIDS)** in integrating adaptation into development and mobilising large-scale climate finance.

#### **Funding:**

Germany: USD 63.25 million

Spain: USD 36.8 million

Total: ~USD 100 million

#### 3. DRC Launched National Digital Carbon Credit Registry

The Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) introduced a national digital registry to record, verify, track, and regulate all carboncredit projects, helping the country protect its forests and generate carbon revenue.

#### 4. Cambodia Joined Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty

Cambodia became the 18th country to join the Fossil Fuel **Treaty**, a global campaign to:

- Stop new fossil-fuel projects
- Phase out coal, oil, and gas production

India has not joined the treaty.

#### 5. 17 Countries Joined the Blue NDC Challenge

The Blue NDC Challenge, jointly launched by Brazil and France, aims to integrate ocean-based climate solutions into national climate commitments (NDCs).





#### Countries that Joined (17):

Brazil, France, Australia, Fiji, Kenya, Mexico, Palau, Seychelles, Belgium, Cambodia, Canada, Indonesia, Portugal, Singapore, Chile, Madagascar, United Kingdom.

#### Other Major Announcements at COP30

- USD 1.3 trillion climate finance annually by 2035 committed for global climate action.
- Calls issued to end and reverse global deforestation by 2030.
- Initiatives such as the Global Implementation Accelerator and Belém Mission to 1.5°C were launched to track NDC progress.
- The Just Transition Mechanism supported fossil-fueldependent economies.
- Brazil introduced roadmaps for equitable fossil-fuel transition and deforestation control.
- The **Belém Health Action Plan** connected climate policies with public health.
- The TFFF highlighted financial rewards for countries protecting tropical forests.
- Climate-Trade Dialogue promoted alignment between trade rules and climate goals.
- The Global Mutirão Agreement reinforced multilateral climate cooperation.

#### **Earthshot Prize 2025**

The Earthshot Prize 2025 was awarded in Brazil to:

- re.green (Brazil)
- City of Bogota (Colombia)
- High Seas Treaty (Global)
- Lagos Fashion Week (Nigeria)
- Friendship (Bangladesh)

Each winner received €1 million.

#### COP31 Host (2026)

The **31st UN Climate Change Conference (COP31)** will be **hosted by Turkey in 2026**.

# Four New Labour Codes made effective to Simplify and Streamline Labour Laws

In November 2025, the Government of India (GoI) officially enforced four major labour codes—the Code on Wages (2019), the Industrial Relations (IR) Code (2020), the Code on Social Security (2020), and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions (OSHWC) Code (2020).

These codes came into effect on 21 November 2025, replacing and consolidating 29 existing labour laws into a unified and simplified framework.

The Code on Wages was earlier **notified on 8 August 2019**, while the remaining three codes were **notified on 29 September 2020**.

- What? GoI enforced four major labour codes
- Which Codes? Wages Code (2019), IR Code, Social Security Code, OSHWC Code (all 2020)
- Effective From: 21 November 2025
- Replaced: 29 existing labour laws
- Core Reforms: Minimum wage right, gig worker coverage, fixed-term employment parity, 8-hour workday, appointment letters for transparency

#### Code on Wages, 2019 - Key Provisions

#### 1. Consolidation of Four Laws

#### Merged:

- Payment of Wages Act, 1936
- Minimum Wages Act, 1948
- Payment of Bonus Act, 1965
- Equal Remuneration Act, 1976

#### 2. Minimum Wage for All

A statutory **right to minimum wages** for all employees in both organised and unorganised sectors.

#### 3. National Floor Wage

No state may fix wages below the *floor wage*, ensuring nationwide uniformity.

#### 4. Wage Fixation Criteria

Skill level, location, and nature of work must guide minimum wage decisions.

#### 5. Gender Equality

No discrimination based on gender—including **transgender** identity.

#### 6. Wage Payment Rules Expanded

Timely wage payment and controls on deductions now apply to all employees (not limited to those earning below ₹24,000/month earlier).

#### 7. Overtime

Overtime wages must be at least 2× the normal wage.

#### Industrial Relations (IR) Code, 2020 – Key Provisions

#### 1. Fixed-Term Employment

Fixed-term workers get **equal pay and benefits** as permanent workers, including **gratuity after one year**.

# 2. Re-skilling Fund

A fund created for retrenched employees, with contributions equal to **15 days' wages per worker**.

#### 3. Trade Union Recognition

A union with **51% membership** becomes the **Negotiating Union**; otherwise, a Negotiating Council forms.

#### 4. Expanded Worker Definition

Includes journalists, sales promotion staff, and supervisors earning up to ₹18,000/month.

# 5. Higher Threshold for Lay-off/Retrenchment/Closure

Approval threshold raised from **100 to 300 workers**.





#### 6. Women's Representation

Mandatory proportional representation of women in grievance committees.

#### 7. Work-from-Home Provision

Permitted through mutual consent in service sectors.

#### 8. Direct Tribunal Access

Allowed if conciliation fails within 90 days.

#### 9. Notice for Strikes/Lockouts

Mandatory 14-day notice, bringing uniformity.

#### Code on Social Security, 2020 - Key Provisions

#### 1. Expanded Social Security Coverage

Covers unorganised, gig, and platform workers.

#### 2. ESIS Nationwide Coverage

ESIS became applicable across **all of India**, not just notified areas.

#### 3. EPF Inquiry Timelines

Inquiries must begin within **5 years** and end within **2 years** (extendable by 1 year).

Appeals require only **25% deposit** of the disputed amount.

#### 4. Gig & Platform Workers Included

New definitions added—gig worker, platform worker, aggregator.

Aggregators contribute **1–2% of turnover**, capped at **5% of payments to workers**.

#### 5. Social Security Fund

Dedicated fund for life, disability, health, and old-age benefits for unorganised and gig workers.

#### 6. Uniform Definition of Wages

"Wages" = basic pay + DA + retaining allowance (must be **50%** of total remuneration).

#### 7. Gratuity for Fixed-Term Employees

Eligibility reduced to one year instead of five.

#### 8. Compounding of Offences

- Fine-only offences: 50% of maximum fine
- Fine/imprisonment offences: 75% of maximum fine

#### OSHWC Code, 2020 - Key Provisions

#### 1. Objectives

- Ensure worker safety, health, and dignity
- Create a simplified and business-friendly regulatory system

#### 2. Unified Registration

Electronic registration required for establishments with **10+ employees**.

#### 3. Mandatory Appointment Letters

All workers must receive appointment letters outlining job roles, wages, and benefits.

#### 4. Wider Coverage of Workers

Definition of inter-state migrant workers expanded to include direct, contractual, and self-migrant workers.

#### **Benefits Include:**

- Annual travel allowance
- Portability of PDS & social security
- Toll-free helpline access

#### 5. Expanded Journalist & Cine Worker Definitions

Covers all employees in electronic media and audio-visual content sectors.

#### 6. Women's Employment

Women permitted to work across sectors, including **night shifts**, with consent and safety measures.

#### 7. Victim Compensation

At least **50% of fines** imposed on offenders to be paid to victims or their families.

#### 8. Contract Labour Threshold

Raised from 20 to 50 workers.

#### 9. Safety Committees

Mandatory for establishments with 500+ workers.

#### 10. Working Hours

- 8 hours/day, 48 hours/week
- Overtime at 2× wage, with worker consent

#### 11. Revised Factory Thresholds

- With power: 10 → 20 workers
- Without power: 20 → 40 workers

#### 12. Annual Health Check-ups

Free yearly health examinations for employees.



#### Australian Open 2025 Badminton held in Sydney, Australia

**The Australian Open (AO) 2025 Badminton**, officially titled the Sathio Group Australian Open 2025, is a Badminton World Federation (BWF) Super 500 tournament, held at the State Sports Centre in Sydney, Australia, from 18 to 23 November 2025.

Indian badminton player Lakshya Sen (world Rank 11) clinched the men's singles title at the Australian Open 2025 by defeating Japan's Yushi Tanaka 21-15, 21-11, marking his first title of the 2025 season and the sixth BWF World Tour crown of his career.

He became the second Indian to win a BWF World Tour title in 2025 after Ayush Shetty at the US (United States of America) Open Super 300 in June 2025.

- Indian Army conducted "Op Drishti" eye-care outreach, screening over 2,000 people and performing 400 advanced surgeries at Command Hospital, Udhampur under Brig. S.K. Mishra.
